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## INTRODUCTION

*“Our world has been through enough, but what scares us most is that the worst is yet to come”.*

While we were rising from the pandemic, the Ukraine war placed all of us in a vulnerable situation yet again. There has never been enough consensus that we are a global community and need to engage accordingly. While Sankalp reinstated its commitment towards entrepreneurship-led development, we additionally drove the narrative of collaboration and empathy to engage and thrive in the global ecosystem.*

*With the consistent hope to bring meaningful and thought-provoking sessions at the summit, I am extremely grateful to all the 209 speakers, 5 program partners and 3000+ attendees across the world. Your presence in the platform has been inspiring and supporting us to constantly further the narrative of sustainability.*

*We were able to capitalize the virtual convening as we had 18 journalists from 15 media houses covering various sessions at the summit. A key summit highlight this year was the representation from prominent mainstream media – Shereen Bhan, CNBC TV18, Govindraj Ethiraj, IndiaSpend, Ajita Shashidhar, Fortune India, Varsha Meghani, Forbes India, Swati Khandelwal, Zee Business & Devanshi Vaid, IDR. The participation from media is also reflective of perceptions towards the UN SDGs as mainstream business and thus highlighting both the challenges and opportunities they necessitate. We take extreme pride in seeing our last year's theme #MainstreamingImpact come to life! We have also seen an increase in engagement from the government and private sector to transform impact together.*

*The team at Sankalp recognizes the need and opportunity to expand the global ecosystem and thus decided to have a virtual convening. We were thrilled to see the increase in reach and participation from more than 118 countries. The flexibility of attending sessions and engaging on our community platform boosted conversations and meet-ups amongst our attendees and panelists. While we were able to see enhanced participation, we are definitely contemplating the human connection of personal relationships built in-person. As we speak, the team is gearing for the next summit in-person in India!*

*In continuation to our 13 years of journey, we continued to catalyze entrepreneurs who are committed to impact. This year, we had an overwhelming number of entries with nearly 300 applications from 43 countries globally. To narrow down to the best of the best, we hosted two investor screening committees, and a prestigious Grand Jury to select 7 global award winners. We saw an increase in diversity of entrepreneurs pitching from Tier 2 & 3 cities and further remote areas as they leveraged the virtual platform. Like last year, we hosted an ecosystem award and had 2381 voters help us choose our final awardee!*



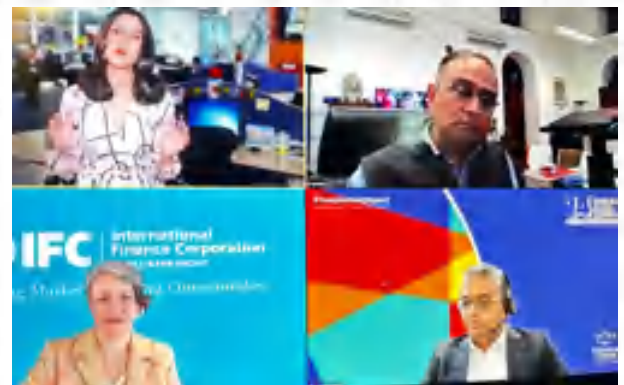
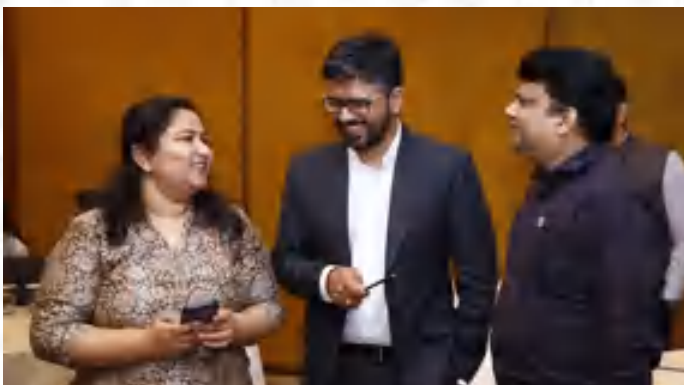

# THEME: #TRANSFORMING IMPACT

## Entrepreneurship. Collaboration. Empathy

While the world continues to recover from the pandemic, the rise in the climate crisis demands attention and action. South Asia recorded the highest temperatures in summer over 120 years. The increase in land temperatures and extreme heat waves are crippling power and water supplies across countries. This global climate crisis threatens the lives and livelihoods of over 100 million in extreme poverty.

Despite the fact that Africa's economy relies heavily on agriculture, the vast majority of its production is entirely dependent on rainfall, which is becoming more and more erratic – alternating between droughts and floods across the continent.

The impact on the Global South countries is severe. Empathy to look beyond our own personal world is needed now more than ever.

Sankalp brought together a community of global entrepreneurs and practitioners who are driven by impact. Building on the discourses around key thematic areas of gender and livelihoods, agriculture, climate change and energy, circular economies, water, health and sanitation, and financial inclusion, we will continue to convene the ecosystem. We commit to creating such platforms, recognising that we are all interconnected and celebrating the opportunity of collaborating across geographic borders to achieve the SDGs.



# OUR THEMATIC AREAS

## INCLUSIVE FINTECH & FINANCIAL SERVICES



Financial inclusion is a key enabler to reducing extreme poverty and boosting shared prosperity to achieve sustainable development goals. The COVID-19 crisis reinforced the need for increased digital financial inclusion which involves deploying the cost-saving digital means to reach financially

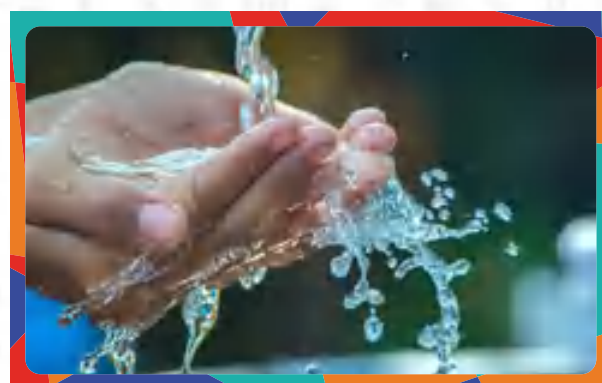
excluded and underserved populations. The provision of adequate, accessible, and affordable financial services by different startups and firms already in the financial space could increase business opportunities, expand investments, and significantly contribute to economic growth.

Globally, 2 billion people are financially excluded, and around 200 million micro, small, & medium enterprises have little to no access to credit. We hosted conversations to improve access to finance for last-mile consumers by bringing forward innovative technology partnerships & improving product affordability. We also looked beyond credit to examine micro-investing, micro-savings, & micro-insurance for millions of low-income women.

## HEALTHCARE, WATER & SANITATION FOR BILLIONS

COVID-19 has exposed the inadequate access to healthcare across the world - even in developed countries. The enormous pressure this unprecedented pandemic has put on medical facilities and frontline health workers has been unimaginable. Safe WASH is not only a prerequisite to health, but contributes to livelihoods by creating resilient communities. Through water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) investments, we aim to improve health outcomes, providing improved access to safe water supply and sanitation, and supporting approaches that can be brought to scale and sustained.

Inclusive business models are offering access to healthy, hygienic lives. These services can lower healthcare costs and save time for poorer populations. The results can be immediate



and long-term, providing vital economic and social benefits to millions of people. We hosted conversations around the lack of access to water, adequate nutrition & sanitation that has deepened this crisis for vulnerable populations, and the solutions that entrepreneurs can offer for the emerging 3 billion.

## GENDER LENS INVESTING, & WOMEN LEADERS



Women across the world have faced a disproportionate impact of the pandemic. While

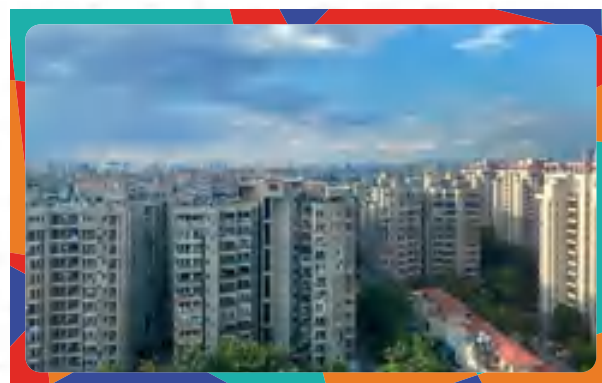
access to healthcare, technology and telephony, and education have dramatically improved for women, the same cannot be said for the current condition many women face in much of the developing world. The summit showcased of women entrepreneurs navigating through these challenges to address climate change and make a radical shift in sexual and reproductive health.

Without gender equality today, a sustainable, more equal future remains beyond our reach. Gender is a cross-cutting theme and will feature in all thematic sectors.

## AFFORDABLE HOUSING

In the backdrop of impending large-scale urbanisation, it is imperative to identify, evaluate and address the challenges faced by the affordable housing consumer. In 2020, 30% of all households had “unaffordable” rent or mortgage payments, defined as exceeding 30% of monthly household income. In addition to rent costs, housing-related expenditures (housing, water, electricity, gas, etc.) should also be considered which further aggravate the issue.

There is a need for accelerated flow of housing finance, and promotion of environment-friendly, cost-effective technology. At Sankalp this year,



we brought leading voices from the affordable housing ecosystem so as to help millions of communities across the Global South.

## IMPACT INVESTING, BLENDED FINANCE & COLLABORATIVE PHILANTHROPY



Despite the global rise of impact capital, the availability of capital for innovation, early-stage ideas and enterprises still represent less than 5% of asset allocation. We hosted conversations on blended finance, impact investing and collaborative philanthropic funding models as options to bridge the SDG financing gap.



## CLIMATE CRISIS – FINANCE, RISK, & OPPORTUNITY

No country today is immune from the impacts of climate change. According to research, climate change could drive 216 million people to migrate within their own countries by 2050. The urgency and scale of the challenge requires countries to learn quickly from each other, adapt to their own special circumstances, and be bold in implementing policies that bend the emissions curve. We need to be prepared for the low-carbon, resilient transition to enable building climate-smart economies that are green, resilient, and inclusive.

The impact of climate change on vulnerable communities will be devastating. We hosted conversations on climate risk pricing for financial institutions, blended finance vehicles, access to climate financing for MSMEs & the need to leverage private sector capital for on the ground solutions. We also hosted conversations around off-grid & decentralized renewable energy stakeholders



to increase their capacity & potential to scale across markets. Further conversations addressed corporate ESG ratings for the private sector that can help drive the world to a low carbon economy. In addition, we shed light on the most vulnerable taking the most challenging role of climate change. A conversation on women inclusion in climate change brought a new perspective.

## AGRICULTURE – INCREASING RESILIENCE OF SMALLHOLDER FARMERS



One-third of food produced globally is either lost or wasted. Addressing food loss and waste is critical to improving food and nutrition security, as well as helping to meet climate goals and reduce stress on the environment.

Today, farmers are facing a plethora of challenges

including soil and resource degradation, fragmentation of land holdings, dismal gender roles, and climate change. We wish to support smallholder farmers transit to practices that will increase their resilience, sustainability, and profitability.

The use of technology can significantly impact farmers' incomes by helping improve productivity, reduce the cost of cultivation, fetch better prices for their produce, and help mitigate the negative impacts arising from weather fluctuations. Agricultural development is one of the most powerful tools to end extreme poverty, boost shared prosperity, and feed a projected 9.7 billion people by 2050. Growth in the agriculture sector is two to four times more effective in raising incomes among the poorest compared to other sectors.



## CIRCULAR ECONOMIES



Due to global trash trade, 75% of globally exported waste ends up in Asia. The continent finds itself struggling to achieve adequate waste

management and disposal practices to keep up with the rapid urbanization.

With 60 million people employed in the textile value chain, the impact on those working in this sector — artisans, workers, women, and other communities — has been immense during the pandemic. Furthermore the textile & apparel industry is the 2nd most polluting industry globally and we want to change this. We advocate to apply Principles of circularity to various sectors including agriculture, consumer goods & manufacturing.

## THE FUTURE OF WORK(ERS) & GIG ECONOMY

After 2 years of the pandemic, workers continue to struggle to find decent work and income. Rural livelihoods within agriculture and livestock production are undergoing a major crises due to climate change. In addition to geographic difficulties, discrimination on the basis of gender, race, caste, and disability is creating further unemployment. Given the positive correlation between livelihoods and economic growth of a country, urgent necessary measures are required.

As we navigate a new normal, conversations have shifted to WFH, localised manufacturing, & hyper-local markets. Job security for gig economy workers, securing the livelihoods of migrant workers, and steady labour supply for MSMEs



are now top of mind. We examined strategies to maintain an adequate supply of jobs, which is the bedrock for sustained prosperity, inclusion and social cohesion in emerging economies.

# INSIGHTS FROM GLOBAL LEADERS

2661 participants from 118 countries attended the Sankalp Global Summit 2021. Some key takeaways shared by leaders serve as testimonies to the event.

Sankalp not only brought together investors, businesses, and governments across the world but there was a lot to learn from companies

contributing to the theme “Transforming Impact” like World Economic Forum, Unilever, Zomato, Yunus Social Business, Habitat for Humanity, etc as well as ingenious start-ups. The key takeaway discloses that we have an opportunity for a smart economic recovery across the Global South that can lead to a sustainable and equitable world.

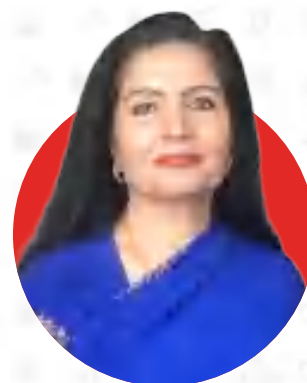

We have good practices and success models which should be built upon but also the economies of India and Africa should draw upon each other's success stories for mutual benefit and for leapfrogging development.

## Opening Plenary - Transforming Impact Across the Global South

This session served as a reality check of today. We are not yet done with the pandemic that is still taking lives and disrupting economic growth in emerging markets. Developmental progress has regressed, more people are being pushed into poverty, and already vulnerable populations continue to be adversely impacted.

We would like to embrace three fundamental shifts in thinking along with the Sankalp community of practitioners as we navigate this changing world dynamic. We need to think along these three frames:

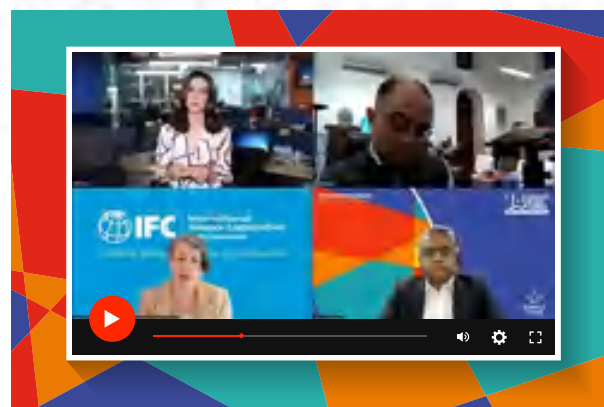
- Transformational change versus baby steps
- Interconnectedness versus individualism
- Making the change happen versus waiting for the change

On the same lines, Vikas Bali, kickstarted the session with reflecting on Intellicap's learnings over the years and a call for action for deliverables from public and private sector. Here are key reflections from him:

- There was stress on the need for capital, knowledge and networks to come together
- Requirement of a concerted effort for 4-5 years to drive sustainable growth of entrepreneurs.
- Call to large private sector to do better
- Need to create resilient mindsets

Here are key important discussions:

- Wendy Werner highlighted that India is a point of light - growth continues to be strong, national capital is improving. She also mentioned that MD (IFC) has committed to do double of what they do in India
- Sandeep emphasized that for the world to achieve climate goals, India has to meet its climate targets and shared that India may achieve Climate SDGs before 2030. India is aggressively innovating and has put the first installment to export Green Hydrogen
- Zaved shed light on the role of private sector in supporting government to standardize ESG frameworks. He also recommended all start-ups to continue creating value for people. As soon as that happens, valuations will go up too.

## Main Stage Plenary - ImpactTech Investing: Dichotomy or Paradigm Shift?

When it comes to investment themes, Impact and Technology have always been discrete buckets for investors. Perhaps the belief that VC investing is primarily driven by financial objectives whereas impact investing is only about seeking people and planet outcomes has led to such a segregation.

The truth is Impact and Technology have never been two unrelated paradigms. Both styles of investing are deeply intertwined and form a continuum rather than a dichotomy. The global ESG transition being extensively embraced by tech giants, unicorns and investors across asset classes demonstrates this phenomenon.

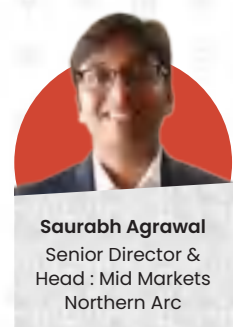
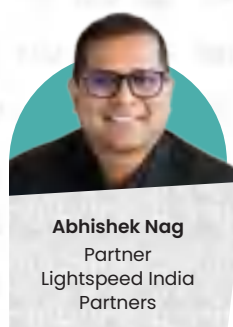
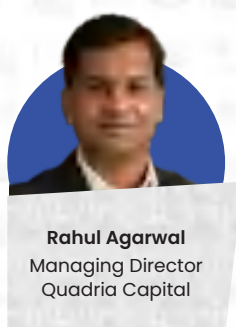
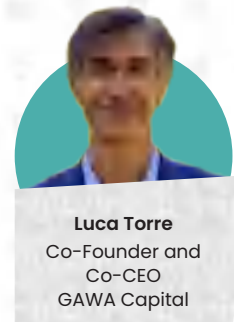
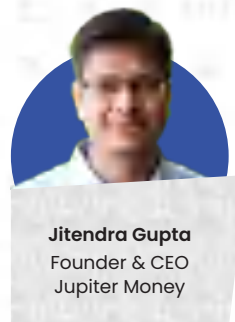
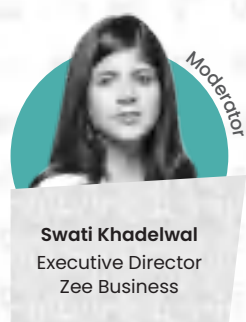
Impact+Tech (or ImpactTech) is often misconstrued as reluctantly espousing ESG factors as an after-thought for enhancing investment worthiness, or employing emerging technologies one dimensionally to deliver impact.

Scaling up is an inherent objective of every venture, whether digital or impact, intending to solve a grand challenge. For businesses, ImpactTech is about designing business models from the ground up which leverage both technology and impact as sustainable competitive advantages to achieve scale. The next 3 billion presents the largest underpenetrated market for digital businesses, whereas impact ventures are transforming their business models for scalability through digital inclusion.

For investors, the ImpactTech dimension has always been profoundly ingrained in the investment thesis across strategies, sectors and stages. Reclassifying ImpactTech as a distinct and broad-based investment theme would simplify investments at the intersection of impact and technology to empower digital businesses solving global challenges.

## Enabling the Lowest Common Denominator: Product, Agency and Economic Empowerment of Rural Women Entrepreneurs

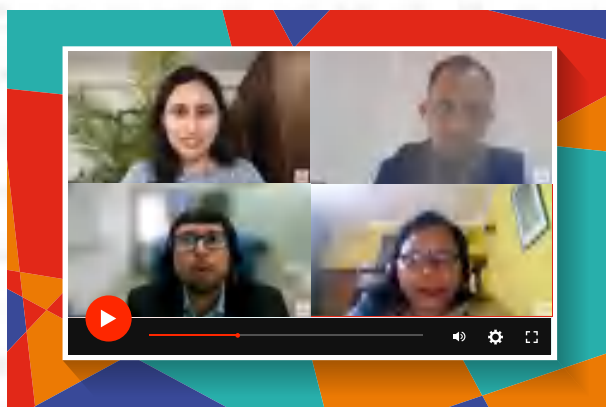
We examined the role of Financial Literacy (FL) and Entrepreneurial Orientation (EO) in enabling economic empowerment of women micro entrepreneurs. The discussion explored the role of agency measured by the demand side factors of FL and EO, given common supply conditions, in enhancing the economic empowerment of rural women.

Also, studies on microfinance credit repayment behaviour have investigated various reasons for the limited ability to repay ranging from borrower profile to loan product types. However, sparse attention has been given to the repayment ability of borrowers in the face of covariate shocks. We analysed the interplay of covariate shocks with borrower and product characteristics to impact repayment behaviour of micro-borrowers.

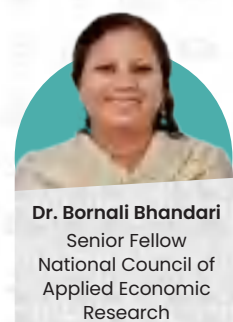
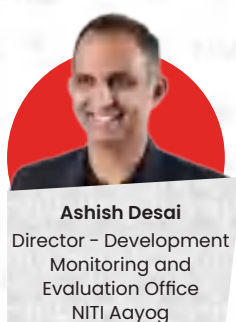
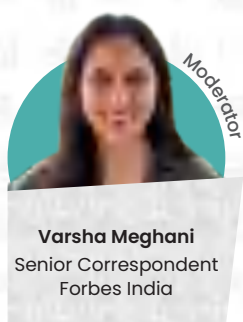
Our findings can serve as valuable inputs for building risk-based pricing models for poor customers and may help in formulation Credit policies and Credit assessment tools for the micro borrower segment. The discussion also aims to fill an important gap in the literature on women's empowerment and can assist in framing policy interventions and training programs to support women's economic empowerment.

### Here are few key discussions from the session:

- A combination of skills defines entrepreneurship. Developing women entrepreneurship requires honing the combination of financial, social and technical skills
- Financial literacy continues to remain a challenge not because of access, but lack of basic literacy skills in women. There is hope with NEP 2020 to support vocational training and building entrepreneurial mindset early on.
- "Empowerment in one context may not be empowerment in another cultural context".- Prof. Rudra Sensarma
- The session requests the government to provide grants and allow CSR for FL training and intangible resources (access to marketplace).

## Multilateral Partnerships to design policies on Global Green Growth & Sustainability

In 2009, The Global Green New Deal (GGND) asked all governments to enhance funding for green sectors. The focus was directed toward (i) economic recovery; (ii) poverty eradication; and (iii) reduced carbon emissions and ecosystem degradation. It also recommended developing economies spend at least 1% of GDP to improve climate, health, and sanitation facilities.

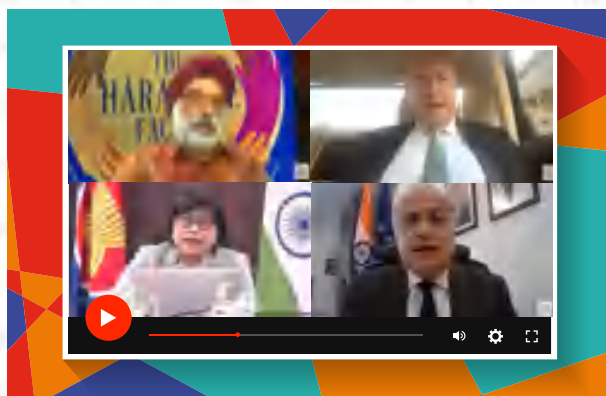
India continues to carry a macro-sustainability approach to development partnerships, ensuring mutual benefits. India's Green Strategic Partnership with Denmark serves as a great example for countries delivering ambitious climate and energy goals together. Moreover, India's strategy to find synergies between nations is found in its declaration with the European Union to support smart and sustainable cities and green infrastructure. The two nations are committed to promoting investments in sustainable urbanization, climate action, and disaster risk

reduction in cities. India and Indonesia instituted several Joint Working Groups (JWGs) to look into varied (health, counter-terrorism, agriculture, coal) aspects of bilateral cooperation.

With the current G20 presidency soon to be taken over by India, this session discussed the unique opportunities for emerging economies to shape the global agenda.

### Key discussions from the session:

- Amb Gurjit Singh shared his excitement about the LIFE initiative to be launched by PM Modi. He emphasized that if individuals do not change our behavior, change would not happen. In reference to his book, he also discussed the role of multilateral cooperation in making the green transition.
- Ambassador Freddy Svane shared that Denmark hosted the COP15 where USD 100 billion promised by the developed countries. 1% has been set aside by the Government of Denmark last year.
- Ambassador Ugo Astuto declared that the weaponization of Moscow towards the energy crisis is happening. Europe was 40% dependent, now it's 9%.
- Ambassador Ina Hagniningtyas Krishnamurthy shared GCF has raised USD 10.3 by 2018. By 2022, they plan to raise USD 206 million. This can channel funds to green projects. Their biggest challenge is balancing the appetite for development with the green understanding.

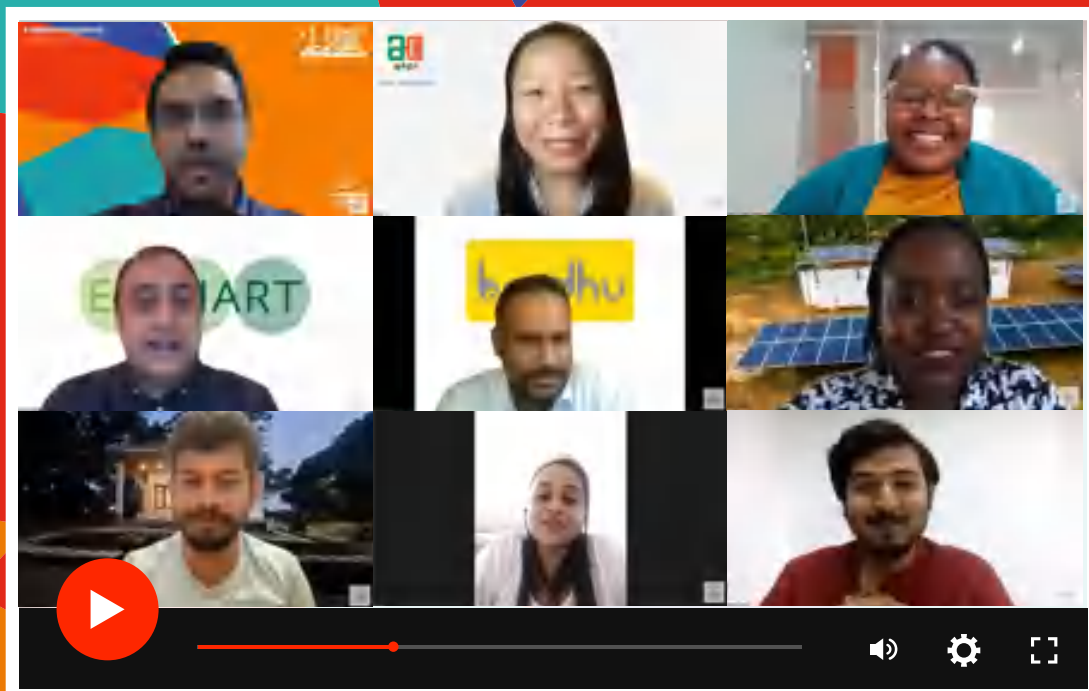

This year, we had an overwhelming number of entries with nearly 300 applications from 43

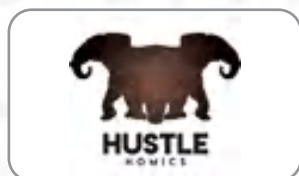

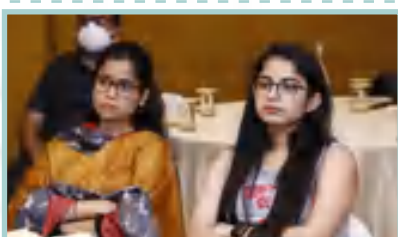
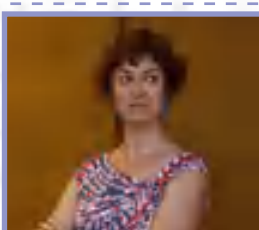
In the pursuit of creating effective Global South connections, they partnered with Sankalp Forum to accelerate the growth of enterprises in the primary health sector across an in person workshop in Delhi, a Roundtable on Innovative Financing, a panel discussion on "Tackling Taboos - Tackling Taboos: Showcasing innovations in sexual and reproductive health, and a closed door investor deal room for entrepreneurs.

## Improving Health Care Provider Performance: Evidence-based approaches and country illustrations (In-Person Workshop in Delhi)

Millions of dollars are spent every year in efforts to improve health care worker performance, often with a little impact. The use of technology and digital solutions to transform how countries improve health care worker learning and performance is widely recognized, yet the reliance on in-person training and supportive supervision remains a significant investment. Gavi and Jhpiego hosted an interactive session to share recent situational analysis findings on the current state of global learning and performance management initiatives, review promising evidence-based, digitally supported approaches

or strategies, and highlight lessons learned from country implementation.

This session was targeted to those investing in improving and supporting health care worker learning and performance, in immunization or other Primary Health Care areas; including national stakeholders, learning institutions, professional councils and associations, donors, investors, private sector digital solution providers, and national implementing partners and organizations.



## Digital Learning and Performance Management Solution Exchange (In-person workshop)

National governments, learning institutions, professional councils and associations, and donors are all interested and invest significant funding and effort into digital solutions to support health care worker learning and performance management. Gavi and Jhpiego hosted a working session to share a new tool that will be used by Gavi and other alliance members to assess digital solutions. Attendees were invited to test the tool to assess their own solutions, provide user-feedback

on the utility of the tool and engage in a discussion of what motivates their company to work with public sector or multi-lateral donor organizations and discuss potential public-private partnership models.

This session was for organizations who provide a digital solution that supports learning and/or performance management—whether focused on health workers or other sectors.





## Roundtable: Innovative financing in primary healthcare in India'

The second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic finally proved to be a decisive reminder of India's crumbling health infrastructure and the need to overhaul it. The government responded with a two-phased emergency response and health systems preparedness packages. The packages speak about creating a network of well-equipped health facilities at all levels of healthcare with steps to avert resource and supply shortages across the system. In recent times, many stakeholders have sought to create a mechanism to blend multiple financing options to ensure sustainable outcomes. Innovative financing like malaria elimination

bonds, vaccine purchases for COVID has achieved some great outcomes for improving accessibility and supporting LMIC health systems in achieving specific aims.

In this session, domain experts from across the health system discussed specific challenges that exist in mainstreaming innovative financing for PHC in India, and provided their insights on what steps need to be taken to make IF in PHC more sustainable, widespread and acceptable to all stakeholders.

## Tackling Taboos: Showcasing innovations in sexual and reproductive health

Sexual and reproductive health remains a challenging topic to tackle across India and the world even today. Along with the traditional approaches of better awareness and access to knowledge and services, it is necessary to harness innovative methods and technologies for enhancing SRH and in making them mainstream which are discussed and debated openly. Jhpiego is currently working with a cohort of entrepreneurs in the domain of sexual and reproductive health in India who are working to tackle both the service and product-level challenges in this domain.

This cohort of entrepreneurs aims to tackle some pressing challenges related to sexual and reproductive health including menstrual health, creating safe spaces for 'taboo' topics like sexuality and sexual health, and other aspects of SRH through cutting-edge online tools, AI-based bots and solutions to reduce and manage waste generated by period products. This session included a discussion on their entrepreneurial journeys, and their experience of working with topics still awaiting open discussion in society.

# UNDP AT SANKALP

The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) is a global organization with 17,000 staff working in approximately 170 offices towards supporting governments in developing strong policies, institutions, and partnerships to achieve the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its 17 Sustainable Development Goals. To help strengthen the climate innovation landscape for women entrepreneurs, UNDP, ReNew Power and the Foundation for Technology & Innovation Transfer (FITT) jointly launched an integrated entrepreneurship development platform.

Women possess knowledge and experience at the local level and are thus imperative to be included in the change. Without gender equality today, a sustainable, more equal future remains beyond

our reach. With this thought, UNDP hosted the session 'Exploring the business of climate through women entrepreneurs' to discuss strategies to help strengthen the climate innovation landscape for women entrepreneurs.

Multiple studies find that when women are in leadership roles in the climate ecosystem, it brings about better policies, more transparency, and efficient utilization of resources. It is observed that international environmental treaties are more prone to be ratified if women are included in the negotiations. Countries across the globe have been able to create more stringent climate change policies due to the increasing number

of women in their parliaments and this has also reduced emissions by a significant amount. In the private sector, there is a direct positive correlation between the percentage of women on board to the disclosure of carbon emissions. In the world of profits, evidence shows that women-founded start-ups generally earn more on every dollar of investment than their male-led counterparts. In fact, even women at the last mile of farming, increase their agricultural yields by 20-30% with the same access to resources as men! Lastly, let's not forget the young woman driving and forcing the world to focus on climate change - Greta Thunberg.

In spite of the proven results, more than 90% of total funding goes to male-led companies. Studies have shown that women in Asia and the Pacific have less time to reskill or network because they do almost four times unpaid care work.

#### Key Learnings from the discussion:

- Shloka made a compelling point that Climate change is a crisis catalyst, it takes the underlying inequities in the society and perpetuates a very gendered developmental

set of outcomes in India and it tears those further apart. She further added that women's vulnerability becomes the primary focus of the conversation and discount the role women play as climate actors.

- Dennis applauded India as it has set itself for clear climate change targets and has stepped forward to lead globally on environmental issues.
- Thomas Kerr stressed on the urgency of the issue and need to invest in resilience. Not just infrastructure, but also soft - social protection safety nets. SMEs can help with a huge amount of innovation and we can help with salvaging those. Pivoting innovations towards green would be important.
- Vaishali shared that data suggests women-run businesses are more profitable. The big problem is insecurity about women's success. We have to become increasingly cognizant that women do as well if not better.

## Showcase of 6 women entrepreneurs

UNDP in partnership with ReNew Power and, FITT (IIT-D), is implementing the “Women Climate Champions (WCC): ImpactAim SDG5 Accelerator Programme”. Administered virtually in 2022, the program supports 6 promising women climate entrepreneurs with a range of support services including tailor-made 1:1 mentoring; strategic peer learning and capacity-building activities, and business growth funds. The selected entrepreneurs

- There is a regression on SDG 11 and it seems like a continuing declining trend over the next few years



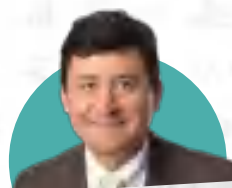

- 30% of the population lives in substandard housing, entrepreneurs are recommended to look for alternative ways to improve housing.

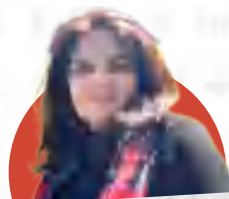

Additionally, they curated a plenary session 'Building a vibrant sheltertech community for Startups in India' to provide valuable insights in the role of various stakeholders to create a portfolio of investible opportunities. They also partnered with us to create a category for the Sankalp Awards on Affordable Housing.

### Highlights from the session:

- Affordable housing is very important considering the sheer potential for impact- 1.6 billion people worldwide lack adequate housing. Added to this are the twin forces of sustainability and digitisation.
- Tapping into the carbon or plastic offset market will be a significant income stream for these enterprises which will also enable the cost of housing to come down.
- The real estate industry is a notorious laggard in the adoption of technology, 80% of all projects tend to get delayed and 20% go over budget. Post the pandemic, builders and investors have embraced technology and automation, there is less reliance on manpower
- Authoritative implementation of laws and guidelines is lacking in the country and is a call to the role of government and need to take policy action.

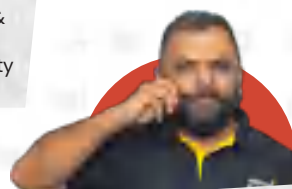

## Accelerating Access to Energy: A showcase of solutions

## ENERGY CATALYST

Despite significant progress in recent years, particularly on access to electricity, we are not on track to meet Sustainable Development Goal 7 (SDG7) to deliver universal access to energy by 2030. Almost 3 billion people remain without access to clean cooking. Without sustained efforts, 650 million people will still be left without access to electricity in 2030, and 9 out of 10 of them will be in sub-Saharan Africa. This affects all development

goals, not just SDG7 as poor access to energy jeopardises healthcare and education provisions, quality of life, gender equity, livelihoods, and much more besides.

The session featured leading Energy Catalyst entrepreneurs working to end energy poverty and showcase their innovations to investors, potential partners and the Sankalp community.

# IDRC AT SANKALP



## How do care businesses enhance outcomes for women and girls?

The CEKH research demonstrates that there are numerous enterprises and business models that operate in the care economy, across themes such as care of people (children, elderly, disabled and sick) and household tasks through home management services and labour-saving technologies such as clean-cooking and access to water. Knowingly or unknowingly, these businesses play an important part in reducing, redistributing, recognizing and rewarding the care work that is otherwise unpaid and falls disproportionately on the shoulders of women, making them 'time-poor'. This session told the story of one such care-business, and through the experience of one of its customers, aimed to bring to the fore the impact it has in reducing the drudgery from women's lives and making them more likely to participate in other economic activities, or simply leisure! The session also engaged with impact-measurement professionals to discuss how the impact of care businesses can be effectively measured and showcased to capital providers.

### Key discussion points:

- Amar discussed IDFC and OSF are supporting a consortium led by fore global of which Intellect is a part, to establish a care economy knowledge hub. The broad intention

of this exercise is to the role that the private sector can play in recognizing, reducing, redistributing and rewarding care work. Further to explore the role that impact capital can play and to foreground this sector as a potential opportunity for impact investors.

- Andrea Azevedo shared that the Investment strategy centered around these 3 parameters:
  - a. redistribution and reduction of care work
  - b. recognition of value of care work
  - c. representation of CW in any intervention planned
- Aimee Gloria shared her consideration of an industry expert by the GoP helped review existing training regulation and developed a hybrid training model with the govt. Which will soon be used across the country.
- Shubhalakshmi stressed on the importance of developing a common language of practice and and sharing good practices across the sector with government as well as private partners.
- Everyone on the panel agrees that the specific relevance of gender lens investing and private sector can play a much proactive role on unpaid care.

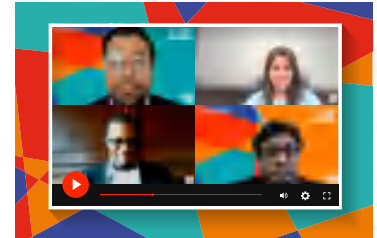

## ESG Masterclass for Entrepreneurs – Embedding ESG in Your Company

ESG is a process, not an outcome. Embedding ESG measures in company operations can help companies be more efficient, save costs and attract investment. The session elaborated on the global trends in ESG, the biggest market opportunities, and the challenges for entrepreneurs in understanding and adopting ESG. Governments and market exchanges all over the world are increasingly requiring companies to report on their ESG indicators and their impact on the environment and society. Regulations have been enacted requiring mandatory ESG and sustainability reporting. However, the variety of reporting standards makes it confusing for companies

and investors to know which ESG measures to adopt, which are effective ESG measures, and

which are greenwashing. A strategic understanding of ESG, and embedding it in operations for the long term, helps avoid potential penalties and risks that come from implementing ESG as a simple checklist. The true value of any policy can be only assessed if social and environmental consequences are taken into account.

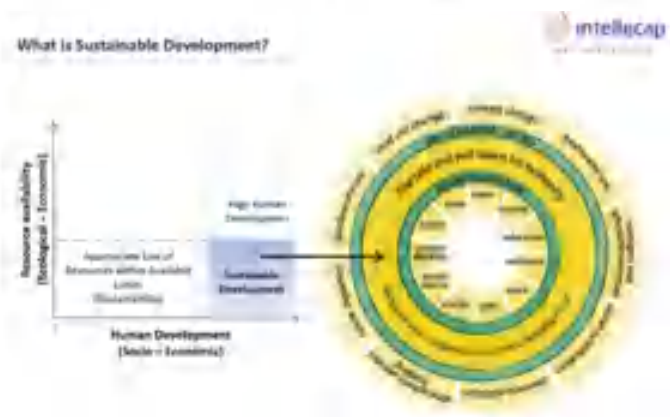

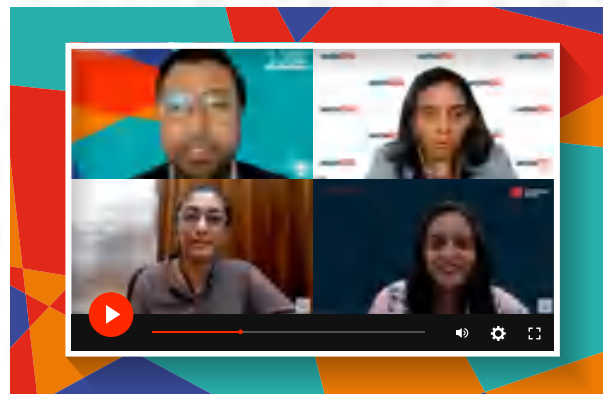

## ESG Masterclass for Investors: Applying ESG Effectively in Emerging Markets

ESG mandates are here to stay. Bloomberg estimates that 33% of all assets under management globally would have ESG mandates by 2025, representing nearly USD 53 trillion. Companies, central banks and development projects are driving organic growth of ESG markets, supported by a focus on green growth and recovery. However, investment and fund managers struggle to implement ESG effectively; and scrutiny from regulators is increasing as the time to achieve the sustainable development goals slowly ticks down. A shift in perspective from risk management to long-term value creation will help funds to implement ESG measures effectively and sustainably. Robust and pragmatic measures to implement ESG metrics are necessary to assess and manage ESG risks for each deal. ESG metrics



and their alignment with the investment cycle help investors understand the potential opportunities for value creation, minimize reputational risks, address investment risks and demonstrate proper management to the limited partners (LPs) and other stakeholders.
